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| Position Summary | The Staff Psychologist provides group counseling and workshops to address students' mental and emotional health needs. The position also provides short-term individual counseling and psychotherapy related to personal and educational difficulties, social conflicts, significant adjustment problems, and mental and emotional disorders, including initial assessments and crisis intervention. The role diagnoses and treats mental and emotional disorders and engages in appropriate clinical collaboration, consultation, and documentation. In addition, the position develops and delivers clinical consultation and outreach programs that address students' developmental issues and mental health needs and provides training to graduate-level practicum and intern students. |
