Position overview

The Ohio State Wexner Medical Center is looking for a highly motivated individual to provide pharmacy services for infectious diseases patients in the acute care setting. In addition, the specialist will be engaged in antimicrobial stewardship activities for the health-system and our stewardship outreach program for network facilities within The Ohio State Health Network. The breakdown is approximately 9-10 months inpatient and 2-3 months on stewardship. We offer a unique practice model that allows pharmacists to practice at the top of their license in close coordination with our providers.

Beyond providing direct patient care, pharmacists will assume leadership roles in identifying evidence-based opportunities for improvement in patient care and organizational processes, participate in hospital and departmental committees and act as a resource to provide answers to drug information questions. There are numerous opportunities to engage in medication use evaluations and quality improvement projects as well as clinical research.

Teaching involvement may include precepting APPE and pharmacy resident learners, didactic lectures at the College of Pharmacy, and providing educational programs for patients and hospital staff.
