At minimum, you must have the following to be considered:

Two-year diploma in a related field (e.g. Interpretation, teaching, communications, performing arts, natural sciences, etc)

Equivalences will be considered on directly related experience or education on the basis of: one year of experience for one year of education or one year of education for one year of experience.

The following are considered assets and should be highlighted in your resume:

Experience, knowledge and competency in: interpretation; written and verbal communication; program development; audience engagement; public speaking; teaching; acting; performing; customer service; ecology and outdoor recreation activities/instruction. Knowledge of Paleaontology, archaeology and Indigenous culture and heritage are considered assets in particular parks.

Cultural Awareness and Support:

We recognize the significance of cultural practices and will work with employees to ensure they have the flexibility and support needed to participate in ceremonies, traditions, and other cultural commitments.
