

**Postdoctoral Researcher - PARCC Philanthropy**  
**Program for the Advancement of Research on Conflict and Collaboration**

**Description**

The Program for the Advancement of Research on Conflict and Collaboration (PARCC) at Syracuse University's Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs seeks to hire a postdoctoral researcher with expertise in philanthropy and foundations to work with an interdisciplinary team on the "Frontlines of Democracy Project." The Frontlines Project is a multi-method, interdisciplinary research effort focused on the global democracy and freedom ecosystem. Specifically, the project investigates the perspectives of philanthropists, foundations, and other funders in terms of how they understand giving and potential investments in democracy and freedom, as well as the perspectives of democracy advocates and activists in terms of barriers, opportunities, and priorities. Through this research, the project team seeks to develop data-driven strategies that strengthen democracy and freedom networks, connect advocates and funders, and direct targeted resources toward critical gaps in the ecosystem.

**Qualifications & Duties**

We seek to hire a postdoctoral researcher with expertise in philanthropy and foundations. The post-doctoral scholar will assist with the design and implementation of large-scale research designs, including the development of data collection instruments such as surveys and interview protocols, the construction of databases, the analysis of qualitative and quantitative data, and the production and dissemination of knowledge through reports, publications, and presentations. The postdoctoral researcher also may engage in the creation of teaching and educational resources, the organization and facilitation of workshops, and team management and oversight, among other duties.

Applicants must have a PhD in public administration, nonprofit management, public policy, political science, sociology, or other related area conferred by the time of appointment. Applicants must demonstrate strong interest in the global democracy movement and expertise in philanthropy and foundations. They also should demonstrate excellent research and data analysis skills, including proficiency with both quantitative and qualitative research approaches, and have outstanding communication skills, including the ability to write for and speak to different kinds of audiences. Applicants should be self-motivated and organized, with strong time management, communication, and team skills.

The postdoctoral researcher position is a one-year (12 month) appointment with the possibility of renewal for up to three years. Review of applications will begin on August 15th, 2025, and appointments may begin as early as September 1, 2025.
